The speech "I Have a Dream" is perhaps one of the most influential speeches of the 20th century. King arrived in India on February 9, 1959, saying that he came not as a tourist, but as a pilgrim. Since the local newspapers in India had covered the Montgomery bus boycott in America, King was already known for his achievements. Although the gap between the rich and the poor in India reminded him of conditions in the United States, King noticed that there seemed to be less crime in India.

King left India with the belief that nonviolent resistance could be used for change not only in the United States but also around the world. Animated films are a powerful form of artistic expression. For much of their history, however, they have been associated with immature programming intended for children. Many of the early animations were based on comic strips but were not specifically aimed at children. Often, they would contain humor or themes that were appropriate only for adults. This led to tensions with angry parents, however.

Complaints about "wicked" content recurred constantly in America in the 1920s. Many American states attempted to pass censorship laws. Keen to overcome these concerns, Hollywood introduced a new moral code, known as the Hays code. Movies and short films, both animated and live action, were profoundly affected by these guidelines until they were discontinued in 1968.

One of the consequences was that animation intended for a mature audience almost ceased to exist in America. Cartoons were written primarily for children, and their emphasis was on simple, humorous subjects.

During these years, animators in Asia and Europe explored themes of greater complexity than most of their American counterparts. When Japanese animated features such as Akira were first seen in the west, they made traditional American cartoons like Scooby Doo seem almost ridiculous.

In recent decades, however, American animation has undergone a maturation process and become more adventurous. Satirical shows like South Park and features like Wall-E have shown that cartoons are not just for children.
