With a large population living in a relatively small area, Taiwan can be a noisy place. A highway or a ___47___ in the island can carry a large amount of traffic every day. The industries that ___48___ the backbone of the economy often rely on heavy machinery, and noise from factories can sometimes be heard over great distances. Not only do the ___49___ activities let people earn money, but they also generate noise pollution. With continued development, construction noise is hard to get away from.

In some areas, the situation can be rather ___50___. Consider how tiresome living right next to an air force base like the one in Hualien or an airport like Taipei's Songshan might be. In the short term, loud noise can cause us to become distracted. No one likes to be woken up from a pleasant sleep or startled by sudden loud sounds. In the most basic terms, abortion can be defined as the “termination of a pregnancy.” An abortion can be done for medical reasons, for example, if the pregnancy might endanger the life of the pregnant mother. In other cases, a rape victim who happens to become pregnant as a result of this crime may choose to abort the unborn child. However, recently, in some parts of the world, another type of abortion has become extremely common—sex-selective abortion.

Generally speaking, sex-selective abortion involves ending a pregnancy because of the sex of the unborn child. According to experts, the usual birth sex ratio is around 103 males to 107 females at birth.

However, in countries where sex-selective abortion is common, this ratio is often 108 males to 102 females. Many experts are **taken aback** by this ratio and believe that it will lead to several problems in the future for the people in these countries, since there will be a higher number of males and a shortage of females.

Sex-selective abortion is notoriously common in countries where the culture and traditions put a greater emphasis on males and less value on females, and the desire for a male child outweighs the desire for a female child. It also occurs in countries with “one-child” polices, where some parents feel they can never be too careful when it comes to having a child. It is particularly common in countries in Asia, with a few exceptions, as well as in parts of Southeast Europe. It is less common in parts of Northern Europe and the United States. In fact, some U.S. states have even outlawed sex-selective abortion.

Though the exact results of increased sex-selective abortion remain unknown, experts say that it will likely lead to an increase in the trafficking of women and prostitution and that it may also lead to an increase in the social gap between genders.

Research into sex-selective abortion continues and though the possible negative consequences are now becoming apparent, the practice itself still exists in many parts of the world.

On Loktak Lake in Manipur, India, families lived in huts on floating islands made up of vegetation, oil, and other materials. Since there was no 36 land for residents to produce enough food, they supported themselves mainly through fishing and trading in lake products. As a result, they didn't have much 37. 

Derek Redmond was born on September 3, 1965, in Bletchley, Buckinghamshire, to parents Jim and Jennie from West India. He attended Roade Comprehensive School in Northamptonshire, where there is now a sports hall in his name. In 1985, he broke the British record for the four-hundred-meter race with a time of just 44.82 seconds.

To achieve his goals, he trained hard and was determined to win no matter what. In 1986, Redmond was a member of the team that won gold in the 4x400m relay at the European Championships and Commonwealth Games. In the following year, he was on the team that won the 4x400m relay silver medal at the World Championships.

However, after he tore his hamstring in the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, he was told by a doctor he could never represent his country in professional sports again. But he did not let this stop him.
