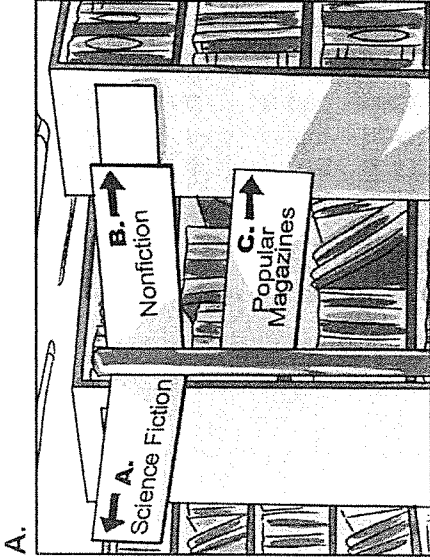

First, millions of trees are chopped down to make paper. 31 *The World Counts*, up to 386 million hectares of forest have been lost in the past two decades. 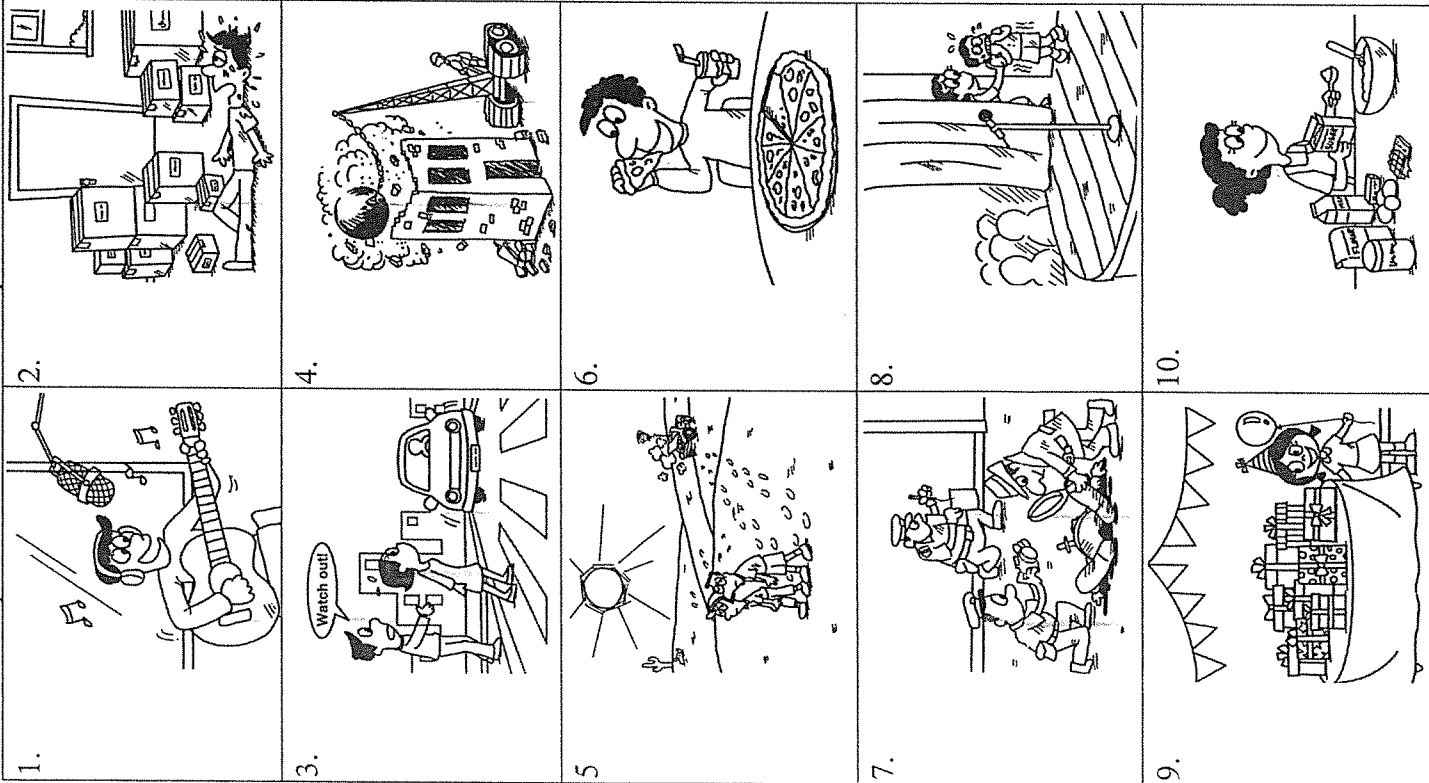
