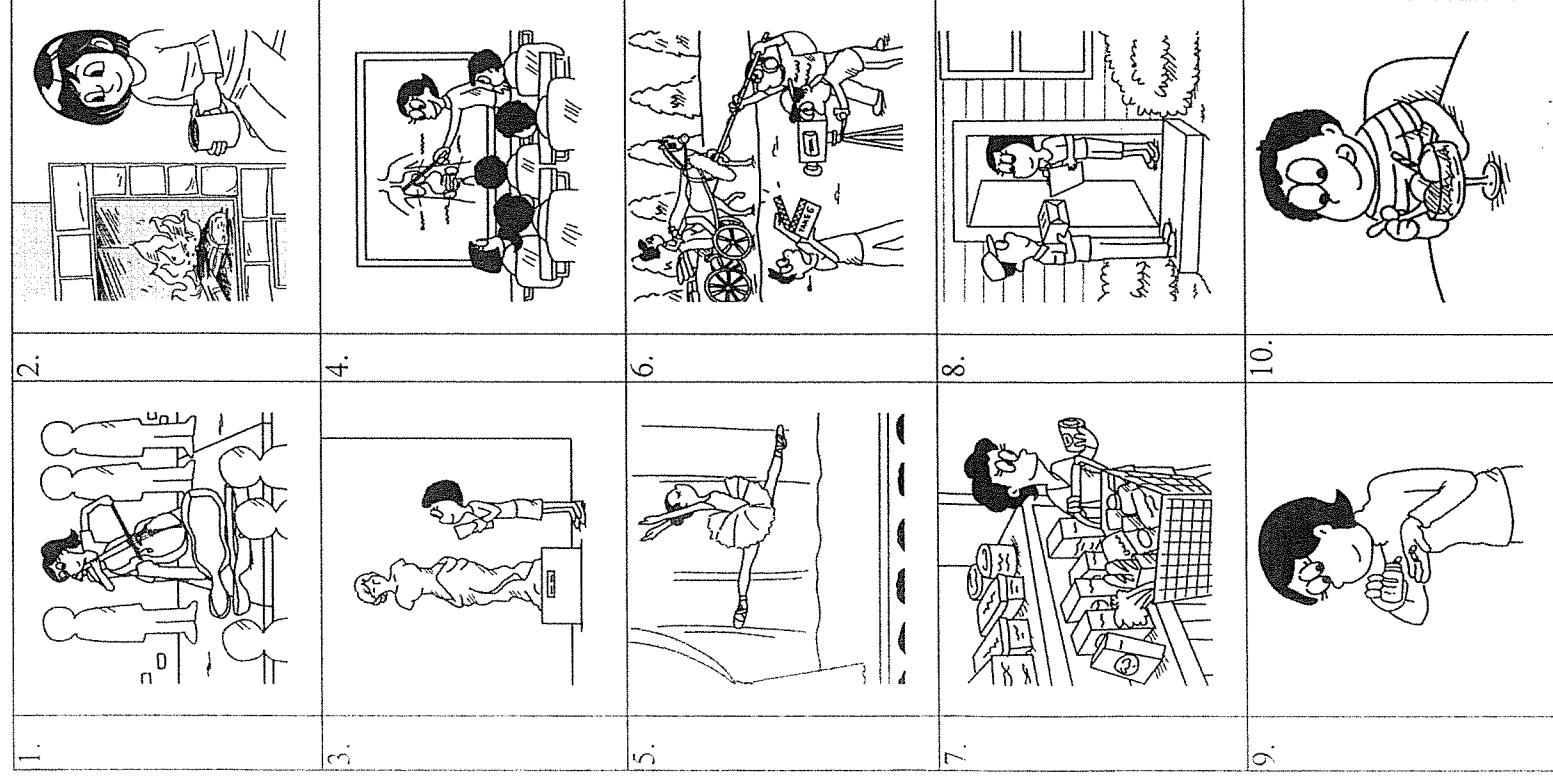






Sperm whales live in every ocean on the planet. Their large, block-shaped heads help them stand out from other whales. They have the biggest heads and brains on Earth. Their brains are five times heavier than a human's. These giant mammals regularly dive to depths of around 2,000 meters and can go 60 minutes between breaths. Sperm whales use echolocation. Their high-pitched sounds allow them to transmit information to one another from hundreds of kilometers away. In addition, these clicks are unique to each whale. Scientists believe this is how sperm whales recognize one another. Sperm whales sleep in a vertical position near the surface of the water. This allows sperm whales to experience a deeper sleep so they can sleep for shorter periods of time. In fact, sperm whales sleep for less than two hours per day. These interesting creatures even inspired a classic novel called *Moby-Dick*. They are truly impressive animals.
