The Best Warm-Up Exercises for Runners

“Stretch, of course!” In fact, most people believe all the warm-up they need before running is simple stretching.

Actually, there are two types of stretching. One is static stretching, where you hold a stretch without moving. The other is dynamic stretching, where you move through a range of motion. The purpose of a warm-up is to get the muscle groups ready for running. Most experts and running coaches no longer consider static stretching a proper warm-up for running because it makes you run more slowly and it can also increase your risk of injury.

Dynamic stretching, on the other hand, includes exercises that get your muscles moving and thus warm up the parts of your body that you will use during a run. Before you run, do about ten minutes of dynamic stretching. This will provide an effective warm-up. It improves blood flow, prepares the muscles, increases range of motion, and makes your running smooth.

The runners that I coach do a dynamic warm-up before every run. It helps them prepare for their workout. It’s especially important to do a dynamic warm-up if you are running a race. A complete dynamic warm-up prevents injuries and makes you a better runner.

In most countries, it is assumed that children attend school, but in Pakistan that is often not the case. An estimated 22.8 million Pakistani children aged 5 to 16 currently do not attend school. 

Homeschooling has been growing quickly over the last decade. For example, it is estimated that from 2015 to 2020, the number of American families that started homeschooling doubled. Yet homeschooling is still subject to myths and misunderstandings. First of all, most people think that homeschoolers don't socialize as much as those who attend traditional schools. The truth, however, is that homeschoolers can socialize more. For them, learning takes place in more places than inside a classroom. By routinely visiting museums, parks, science centers, and other places, they have more opportunities to socialize with adults and other people.

In addition, people might have the impression that homeschoolers do not go to college. In fact, homeschooled students are more likely to attend college than traditionally schooled students. Furthermore, when homeschooled students generally perform better on tests. Another incorrect claim is that homeschoolers lack the opportunity to play sports or participate in extracurricular activities. What most people don't know is that many public schools allow homeschoolers to play on school sports teams or participate in other after-school activities. One key benefit of homeschooling is flexibility for families, so there is no shortage of time for kids to be active outside their daily learning.
