Paragraph B

Have you ever wondered whether coriander is an herb or a spice? Actually, it's both. Herbs come from a plant's leaves, and spices are produced from its seeds, roots, or bark. Since coriander leaves and seeds are both edible, the plant falls into both categories. In North America, however, "cilantro" is the common name for coriander leaves, while "coriander" is used for the seeds.

Coriander likely originated in Central Asia, and the earliest archaeological evidence of its use goes as far back as 9,000 years. Ancient Egyptians and Greeks cultivated coriander for its perfume and medicinal properties. The Romans introduced coriander to Britain, where it was widely used in cooking. In the 17th century, Europeans brought coriander to America, where it became one of the first herbs to be locally cultivated. While most people would describe the smell and taste of coriander as being light and lemony, some have a strong dislike of the herb. They say it has a soapy taste that's too intensive. According to one study, some people have a gene that makes them sensitive to aldehydes, which are organic compounds that make up soap and give coriander its fragrance. However, there are many health benefits associated with this herb, so those who are turned off by coriander should think twice before avoiding it completely.
