I took part in the Marshmallow Challenge and had a lot of fun with this team-building exercise. With 20 sticks of dry spaghetti, a yard of tape and a yard of string, teams tried to build the tallest structure. The tower had to be built in 18 minutes, and it had to be (41) enough to support the weight of one marshmallow at the top. Teams are inclusive of architects and engineers, CEOs, lawyers, business graduates, and kindergartners. I was in a group with some other lawyers, who were good at thinking, planning, and competing. But sadly, my team performed (42) average, ranking second to last. To our surprise, the kindergartners beat us, coming in second! Why could they do better than most adult teams? It's a result of their unique and ideas! All the young kids had smiles on their faces as they took turns adding things to the tower. It's quite normal for many teenagers to stay up late. Because they have so much schoolwork to do and activities to participate in, they often sacrifice sleep so as to get everything accomplished. The result is that many young people are suffering from sleep deprivation. And research has shown that this can be very serious, especially for teenagers.

According to studies, high school students who regularly stayed up very late performed worse academically than those who went to bed earlier. They were less likely to complete their assignment, and they did poorly on standardized exams. They had difficulty concentrating and staying focused on their work. Perhaps even worse, they were more likely to suffer from emotional problems and depression than their peers who got a good night's sleep.

Fortunately, however, teenage sleeping habits can be easily adjusted. First, parents should set a fixed bedtime, preferably before 11:00. Any schoolwork that is not finished by then will just have to wait until the next. Moreover, in one hour or two before going to bed, bright lights should be avoided and only soft, dim lighting should be used. This will help the eyes relax, which will make falling asleep much easier. Also, device such as smartphones and tablet computers should not be used shortly before bedtime. In fact, it is recommended that they be removed from the room altogether while children are sleeping. Over time, this type of routine should be effective in helping teenagers overcome their poor sleeping habits.
