Derek Redmond is a retired British sprinter. During his career, he held the British record for the 400 meters sprint, and won gold medals in the 4x400 meters relay at many international Championships. In 1992, Redmond was in good form by the time of Barcelona Olympics. 
The Brandenburg Gate, which is one of the best-known landmarks of Germany, was built in 1791. ①It marked the start of a road from Berlin to the town of Brandenburg an der Havel. The sandstone structure is composed of 12 columns that create five entrances, and it is 26 meters high, 65.5 meters long, and 11 meters deep.

②In addition to the sandstone structure, a quadriga with a goddess Eirene and four horses was added to it above in 1793, which is not the original design but a very attractive landmark for visitors. As a matter of fact, it was taken to France by Napoleon as a reward since he defeated Prussia in 1806. Not until Napoleon lose the war in 1814 did the quadriga return to German.

However, during World War II, although the gate survived, it was badly damaged. ③But before the gate could be properly repaired, the Berlin Wall was built to separate East Germany from West Germany. So in 2000, work began to rebuild the gate. More than 1,000 stones were removed, repaired, and replaced. The structure was strengthened and years of dirt was removed.

Even though the quadriga experienced a lot of damages, the Brandenburg Gate is still standing there to witness a lot of events, such as the Franco-Prussian War, Hitler's rule, World War II, the Cold War, Revolutions of 1989. ④Throughout its existence, the Brandenburg Gate was often a site for major historical events and is today considered not only as a symbol of the history of Europe and Germany, but also of European unity and peace.
