

Their mission is to give at-risk and abused children a home and help them grow into well-rounded, successful adults. Currently, 19 children from ages 7 to 18 make their home at Bethany. A pioneer among orphanages in Taiwan, Bethany offers parent-style care. Each child belongs to a “family” with parents who watch over them. This way, children not only experience a homey atmosphere, but also have someone to call Mom or Dad. The loving care these parents provide goes a long way toward easing the fears and heartaches of abused children. The parents do their best to help the children under their care flourish.

Bethany Children’s Home was called the Gladys Aylward Children’s Home until 1959. It was originally named for a dynamic woman just 148 centimeters tall who traveled to China in 1932 as a missionary. She loved children and began to save unwanted kids off the streets, eventually having about 100 in her home. Forced to leave mainland China after World War II, Aylward moved to Taiwan and continued her work with orphaned, abandoned and abused children. The current staff of Bethany Children’s Home continue Aylward’s original mission to provide shelter, loving care and counseling to needy children.
