Sleeping while standing up probably doesn't 41 all that comfortable. But for some 42, this is the best way to do it. How are they able to 43 on their feet? Scientists say they can sleep upright because they have the ability to lock their legs in a straight position. This takes the pressure(壓力) off their muscles(肌肉). 44, they don't sleep for very long. Both elephants and horses rest for less than three hours in a 24-hour period, 45. But while they are standing, these animals can't get deep sleep. What this means is that 46 lying down from time to time, they can't get a proper rest. They have to remain(保持) at least partially(部分地) 47 while standing, so they can be alert(警覺) for any predators that may want to hurt them. There are other animals that sleep while standing as well. Flamingos(紅鸕) are famous for sleeping while standing, with one leg raised up and their heads buried under a wing. 48 some other species(物種) of birds, they don't sleep while they are 49. However, they don't necessarily sleep standing up to 50 predators. They do so because, as they mostly live in the water, it's not that comfortable or that easy to lie down.

Instead, they're choosing social media apps that offer disappearing-message features, such as Snap Chat and Instagram. Such apps are also more relaxing, since they contain attractive photos rather than serious political debates.

These features get in the way of the pleasure people take from it while using the social networking site. So is this the beginning of Facebook's end, or can the social media giant find a way to win back the young?

The recent increase in online fake news is often __46__ the rise of social media. Have you ever heard of “click bait”? The word “bait” usually refers to something we put on a fish hook. Usually food, it is the bait that tempts passing fish to bite the hook. __53__ These often contain shocking information that readers just can't resist. Now, while there is nothing wrong with a catchy headline, click bait instead purposefully seeks to trick us. __54__

For example, during the COVID-19 crisis, some headlines on the Internet stated that Amazon owner Jeff Bezos had made \$13 billion in a single day. The headlines caused many people to feel outrage at how the world's richest man was profiting from an increase in online purchases during the pandemic, while millions of others were suffering. However, Bezos didn't actually “make” that much money in one day. Rather, his net worth* had increased due to the rising value of Amazon stocks. Using the word “made” was thus an exaggeration and not exactly correct.

Another type of click bait is an ad or headline containing outright* lies. Have you ever fallen for a link that says “Click here to win a free smartphone,” only to be taken to a page full of other advertisements? __55__ Throughout 2020, articles making claims such as “Bill Gates created COVID-19,” “China grew COVID-19 in a lab,” and “America developed COVID-19 as a biological weapon” appeared all over the Internet. Of course, all this click bait caused millions of Internet users to “get hooked” and also to share the fake content.

So, what can we do to counter the disinformation* spread by click bait? __56__ If you see a headline that seems too shocking to be true, check the source or website name below the link before opening it. If you've never heard of it, do a search on Google about the topic instead. By refusing to give click bait our clicks, it's something we can fix.
