


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

Huang was born and raised in Taiwan before moving to the US e age of nine. He got his first job at 15, working as a dishwasher restaurant. After graduating from college, he secured a position chip designer at Advanced Micro Devices (AMD). He then used experience to found Nvidia in 1993, but it wasn't successful at The company almost went broke in 1997 as it struggled to finish levelopment of the RIVA 128 chip. Nvidia may have failed if it n't for another Taiwanese tech giant: TSMC. Huang wrote a letter to Morris Chang, TSMC's founder, asking to cooperate on the chip's design and help cover some of its uction costs. Chang agreed, and TSMC's timely assistance led Nvidia to achieve its first commercial success. Now, nearly

cades later, their partnership is still going strong.
