You can call the way of tattooing as graffiti to the body. Graffiti and tattoos are both considered forms of drawings or signatures—graffiti falling somewhat into a social nature, with tattoos being more personal. Not everyone likes tattoos or graffiti.

What do tattoos and graffiti have in common? They are created from a desire or need to make a personal expression, which is similar to wearing a uniform or badge. But, would you place graffiti on a new car? Not possible. It could be very expensive to remove and may probably lower the car's value. Yet, some people put graffiti on something more valuable—their body! An automobile can be cleaned, repainted or replaced, but the removal of a body tattoo is difficult and painful. Besides, tattoos can never be effectively removed 100 percent. Even with lasers, tattoos cannot be completely erased, and the skin may have scars.

Graffiti and tattoos are often used by people to express their emotions, such as anger, dissatisfaction or hurt. However, some people get tattoos or like graffiti for other reasons, like copying others or trying to be fashionable. This is known as the “monkey see, monkey do” syndrome, which is common among younger people who want attention or want to fit in.

Tattoos are becoming more popular, and people still get them even though warnings like “you might regret it later” or “it could affect your job” are often heard. Tattoos are not likely to go away anytime soon, though it's still unclear if society will fully accept them.
