In a 2004 TED Talk, psychologist Dan Gilbert challenged some common beliefs about happiness. He said that people often think happiness comes from the freedom to make choices. However, Gilbert proposes that there's another kind of happiness. It's the kind that we create for ourselves when we don't have the freedom to choose what we want. The problem is that society seems to value the kind of happiness that involves a freedom to choose.

Gilbert explained these two types of happiness through a funny example that compared dating and marriage: If you go on a dinner date with your boyfriend and he picks his nose in public, then you may choose not to go out with him anymore. However, if you're married and your husband picks his nose in public, then you might tell yourself that everyone has bad habits, but the important thing is that he is a good husband. In this way, you find a way to be happy with your situation.

Gilbert seems to suggest that when our choices and desires are limited, we can work out a way to create happiness. However, when we have the freedom to choose whatever we want in life, this freedom can lead to unhappiness, as it could cause us to fear or regret wrong choices and decisions.

The “glass ceiling” refers to an invisible obstacle that blocks some people—especially women—from reaching high positions in an organization. Although this ceiling is difficult to break since it’s often disguised as something else, such as company culture or tradition, it can be done.

According to several studies, women are still making less money than men while having the same positions and responsibilities, and company culture plays a big role in maintaining this gap. Although companies should be the ones making changes, it’s also up to women to correct these imbalances. For one thing, many women simply don’t ask for more money, perhaps because they don’t know they are being paid less than their male co-workers. Therefore, it’s important to do research to find out how much one is worth. Second, women often don’t realize how important their contributions are to a company’s overall operation, organization, and productivity. Having a clearer idea of one’s role in a company could help a woman negotiate a higher position or salary. Third, women are typically raised to focus more on pleasing rather than leading **others**. To **get ahead**, women must learn to be more direct and confident in leadership roles. Only in these ways can women stand a chance of breaking that invisible glass ceiling.

The 1950s saw the beginning of the civil rights movement (民權運動), in which black and white people came together to demand racial equality. The event that led to the movement was the Montgomery Bus Boycott (杯葛), which took place after Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat on a bus to a white person. The boycott lasted 381 days; the following year, a federal court (聯邦法院) decided that keeping black and white people apart on buses was illegal.

In 1963, black people in Birmingham, Alabama, tried to put an end to economic policies that were unfair against them. They marched through the streets in protest and avoided businesses that hired only white people. Police responded with violence, setting dogs on the protesters, spraying high-pressure water on them, and arresting them. That same year, over 250,000 participants gathered in Washington, D.C., to demand jobs and freedom for black people. That was the moment when Martin Luther King, Jr., delivered his “I Have a Dream” speech.

In the end, those protests led to concrete changes. The Civil Rights Act of 1964 made it illegal for businesses to deny someone a job based on that person’s race, color, religion, or sex. In addition, the Voting Rights Act of 1965 protected minorities’ right to vote. This was a particularly important step as voting is one of the key steps toward social and political change.
