More than three-quarters of the world's clothing contains at least some cotton. Despite being so common, few people understand the true cost of this fabric. Cotton's importance to the world can't be exaggerated. Made from the fibers of the cotton plant, it is grown in over 70 countries and provides livelihoods for millions of people. Cotton is strong, breathable, and versatile, as it can be mixed with other fibers to make many types of fabrics. However, concerns about its environmental impact and human rights abuses in its supply chain have raised doubts

about the future of the industry.

Cotton requires a lot of water. Producing just one kilogram of cotton is estimated to require between 7,000 and 10,000 liters of water. In some regions, this has caused serious damage to local water resources. For example, the Aral Sea has nearly disappeared due to intensive cotton farming. In addition, the use of pesticides to increase production often pollutes nearby rivers and lakes with harmful chemicals.

Cotton farming provides income for nearly 7 percent of workers in developing countries. Yet many of these workers face long hours, unsafe conditions, and limited rights. This happens because small-scale farmers usually sell their crops through middlemen rather than directly to large clothing companies. The companies push the middlemen for lower prices, and this pressure is passed on to the farmers. As a result, many struggle to cover basic needs, and in the worst cases, forced labor or child labor is used to keep costs down.
