Do you know how the Olympic Games began? Well, it all started with the ancient Greeks. The ancient Greeks loved competition of all types, and every year, each city-state* would send athletes to different festivals as a way to honor the gods. Of these games, the most important was held at Olympia in order to honor Zeus, the king of all gods. These games took place in the summer, only once every four years. The earliest Olympic Games ever recorded was held in 776 BC. However, some historians believe the games first took place hundreds of years earlier. The last ancient games were banned* by the Roman Emperor Theodosius in 393 AD after the Romans conquered* Greece. Centuries later, the modern Olympic Games as we know them began in 1896.

How about the prizes? In the past, winners would receive crowns made of olive leaves. Once they returned to their home city-state, they would receive even greater prizes, such as money or free meals for a lifetime. The citizens and leaders of the city-state took pride in their athletes and made public their accomplishments. Additionally, during the Olympics, leaders from the various city-states discussed important

political and economic matters. Back then, leaders rarely met all together at the same place and time. But as the games approached, everyone would generally agree to a pause in war, and people were able to travel to and from the games freely. Watching the Olympics can be more interesting now that you know its history!

Have you ever faced struggles in life? Well, KFC founder, Colonel* Sanders, did—over and over again. Born on September 9, 1890, on an Indiana farm, he was left to care for his siblings* at age six, when his father died.

At twelve, he left home because his stepfather beat him. He threw away his career twice due to fighting: first as a railroad laborer and second while studying to be a lawyer. He founded a ferry* company, which he later sold to start a lamp-making company, only to discover that a better version of the lamp was already available. By the time he started selling chicken, Sanders was already forty. He later purchased a motel, but it burned down along with his restaurant. Although he rebuilt the motel, World War II forced him to close it down. Finally, at sixty-five, Sanders retired. He received a check for \$105. While considering suicide, he made a list of his life achievements, one of which was being a good cook. So he borrowed \$87 and went door-to-door selling his chicken recipe*.

Ariel: The banker and the lawyer shared some similarities. Both the banker and the lawyer changed greatly over time.

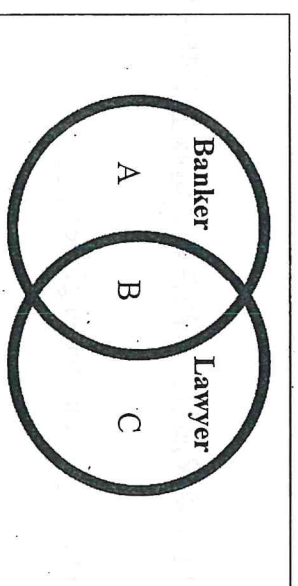
